The CPC table showcased a variety of pamphlets and literature on a three-fold poster board. Additionally, it featured a display from GSO and offered handouts for attendees to take.

Additional convention costs include: CPC Committee flyers for \$25, pamphlets and display materials for \$80, and adhesive for poster board for \$12.15, totaling \$117.15.

In addition, expenses for hotel lodging amount to \$80 per person, shared with the GSR, multiplied by 2 individuals. Mileage costs are \$30 per person, shared with the GSR, multiplied by 2 individuals. Registration fees total \$25, and the banquet cost is \$49.95.
